One of the five successful superclusters unveiled today was the Digital Technology Supercluster. Based in British-Columbia, this supercluster consortium includes major health organizations such as Providence Healthcare (supported by St. Paul's Foundation), Princess Margaret Cancer Centre at University Health Network (supported by the Princess Margaret Cancer Foundation) and SickKids.
